The European Institute for Innovation and Technology (EIT) <u>announced</u> on 9 December 2014 two new Knowledge and Innovation Communities (KICs), health and raw materials, due to start in 2015. KIC Health will be managed by <u>InnoLife</u>, a consortium of some 50 partners, including 4 EARTO members: <u>CEA</u>, <u>RISE Research Institute of Sweden AB</u> and <u>RWTH Aachen</u>. KIC Raw Materials, won by <u>RawMatTERS</u> consortium, has a very strong RTO presence with 12 EARTO members: <u>CEA</u>, <u>Fraunhofer-Gesellschaft</u>, <u>IMEC</u>, <u>RISE Research Institute of Sweden AB</u>, <u>RWTH Aachen</u>, <u>Tecnalia Research & Innovation</u>, <u>TNO</u>, <u>Trento RISE</u>, <u>VITO</u> and <u>VTT Research Centre of Finland</u>.

The idea for the KIC Raw Materials was initiated in 2012 by a group of actors including EARTO members CEA, Fraunhofer, VTT and VITO. Today, the KIC is constituted of some 120 partners from industry, RTOs and universities. RawMatTERS is coordinated by <u>Helmholtz</u> and is planned to last for seven years (renewable), create some 10,000 jobs and turn the challenge of raw materials dependence into a strategic strength for Europe. EARTO, with members in all existing KICs, is glad to so many of them contributing to the two new initiatives!
